

It was my good fortune to be invited to Marty Snyderman's "Atlantis Imagemakers" trip last September along with some very fine underwater photographers and videographers from around the world. I'll be honest. I was feeling a bit intimidated by the credentials of the professional talent I would be rubbing elbows with, but it turned out to be a very friendly and helpful group. Atlantis Dumaguete was totally attentive to everyone as they had been on our HUPS trip there two months earlier. Every employee seemed to know everyone's name on day 1 and took every opportunity to make us feel comfortable and welcome.

Next to me in the awesome camera room, I was setting up next to "The Beast", Nancy McGee's massive housing complete with it's equally massive Nauticam/Atmos video monitor housing, arms, tripod, and multiple 15K lumen video lights. So, yeah, maybe I was starting to become a bit intimidated. We met and she introduced me to the beast and the tension melted away. On numerous occasions, we shared subjects and dive sites. I made sure to watch her as she went about her business, hoping to learn something useful. Throughout the 11 days we were there, she was always smiling and interacting with the group. Following the trip, she was on the top of my list of people I wanted to invite to give a presentation to HUPS. I asked and she accepted to my relief. So please welcome her via Zoom as she shares her experience and knowledge.

\*\*\*\*\*Filming underwater presents a fascinating dichotomy between capturing macro subjects and wide-angle scenes. Macro filming focuses on tiny, intricate marine life, like nudibranchs or shrimp, requiring precision, patience, and specialized equipment to bring out minute details often missed by the naked eye. On the other hand, wide-angle filming highlights grand underwater landscapes, showcasing vast coral reefs, large marine animals, or the interplay of light in open water. It demands a different approach, emphasizing scale and depth. Both styles offer unique storytelling challenges and rewards, requiring distinct techniques to reveal the hidden beauty of the underwater world in its fullest form. Nancy McGee is a celebrated underwater explorer, filmmaker, and adventurer with over three decades of experience. A member of the Women Divers Hall of Fame and an Explorers Club Fellow, Nancy has piloted the Exosuit, scuba dived on all seven continents, and captured rare footage of extraordinary marine encounters, including snorkeling with whales, crocodiles, and diving with an elephant. Known for blending scientific exploration with storytelling, her work promotes ocean conservation and has been featured in numerous documentaries, publications and exhibitions. Nancy continues to inspire others to explore and protect our planet's most remote and fragile aquatic environments.





# **2025 Photo Contest Categories**

January	Single Color Focus (Blue, Red, Green, Yellow, etc.)	Subject must be a single color or shade of color, such as: green moray eel, green parrotfish, soap fish, sharks, sponge, coral .		
February	Fish Portraits	1 or 2 fish (not critters), side on, angled views, or face-to □the-camera shots are what we're looking for.		
March	Groupers, Sweetlips	Groupers typically have a stout body and large mouth, and can be quite large. Sweetlips also have large, fleshy lips.		
April	Long and thin - fish or critters	Any fish or critter that is characterized by long, thin lines.		
May	Pairs (2 of the same)	Two of the same critters or fish, similar in form, matched or associated.		
June	Things that Live in Sand or Muck	Fish or critters that live in sand or muck.		
July	Echinoderms (starfish, urchins, sea cucumbers, etc.)	Echinoderms usually have five-point radial symmetry, and include starfish, brittle stars, sea urchins, sand dollars, sea cucumbers, and crinoids.		
August	Silhouettes	In Silhouettes the outline and shape of the subject are what is important. A good silhouette should have almost no detail observable in the primary subject.		
September	Juveniles of Any Species	A Juvenile can be anything that's not a mature adult, preferably fish or critters that are obviousl still maturing. Such as: juvenile anglefish that have distinct markings or juvenile spotted drums that need to grow into their fins		
October	Corals-Macro (hard or soft)	Coral a tiny soft-bodied animal that typically lives within a stony skeleton grouped in large colonies. The goal is individual polyps, not a reef composition.		
November	Reef scenes with diver(s)	Any kind of reef scene somewhere in the shot, and also must include at least one diver.		
December	Best of HUPS	NOVICE, INTERMEDIATE, ADVANCED, and CREATIVE contests: First place winners from each month's Novice, Intermediate and Advanced categories will be entered automatically for judging. The Creative category lets you enter anything you want as long as you do the photography and any special editing.



# 2025 TGCC MEMORIAL COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP



The Texas Gulf Coast Council of Diving Clubs (TGCC) plans to award one College scholarships (1 @ \$500) during 2025. This scholarship is given in memory of the many deceased members and leaders of our dive community. It is also awarded in recognition for support of the TGCC Scholarship Program by Rodney Dwire, Alicia Grimes, the Houston Underwater Club, the Houston Underwater Photographic Society, Linda Petty and Russell Ramsey. The purpose of this award is to support the higher educational goal of the members, and their families, who support the dive clubs in the Texas Gulf Coast area. The award will be paid by TGCC directly to the college towards tuition.

#### **Eligibility Rules:**

Scholarship applicant must be a college undergraduate or graduate student attending college in 2025, or a high school senior that has been accepted to college in 2025.

The applicant, the parent(s) (biological or through formal adoption), or the grandparent(s) of the applicant, must be an individual member of TGCC or a member of a TGCC member club with dues current in 2025.

Application (see other side) must be received by the TGCC Donations Committee prior to **June 30, 2025**. TGCC will review all completed applications on July 10, 2025.

Applicant shall have the high school/college furnish a transcript of grades, courses and class standing.

#### Scholarship General Guidelines:

Scholarship decisions of TGCC are final.

Scholarship winner is expected to keep TGCC abreast with his/her progress in college.

TGCC reserves the right to not award a prize depending upon the number of entries and qualifications of the applicants.

A personal interview with members of the TGCC Scholarship Committee may be required prior to awarding this scholarship.

Confirmation will be by e-mail. Make sure phone and e-mail data provided is current.

TGCC is offering this scholarship as a reward to TGCC members, TGCC member and associate clubs or the children of these members to thank them for supporting TGCC's efforts in promoting safe sport diving. The committee will take into consideration the applicant or applicant's parents involvement in TGCC and member clubs and/or the diving community in general throughout the year.




